

Estelle Cantillon is FNRS Research Director and professor of economics at the Université Libre de Bruxelles, associate member at the Toulouse School of Economics, research fellow at CEPR (London) and elected member of the Royal Academy of Arts and Sciences of Belgium. Her research lies at the boundary between market design and industrial organization. She has published on auctions, procurement, competition between exchanges, and assignment problems. Her current research focuses on carbon emissions markets, the design of electricity wholesale markets and climate transition policies.

She currently sits on the boards of Belfius group and Tapio, a climate solution start-up, and is a member of the steering committee of Re-Bel (Rethinking Belgium). At ULB, she is the academic director of the Sustainable Development Initiative and has previously been vice-dean

for research (2008-11), director of the master's degree in Business Economics (2013-19) and vice-dean for academic programs (2016-17).

Estelle holds a "candidature" in Physics from ULB, a master's degree in Business Engineering (Solvay Brussels School), an M.Phil. in Economics from Cambridge University and a Ph.D. in Economics from Harvard. She joined the faculty of the Solvay Brussels School in 2004 and has held faculty appointments at Yale University, Harvard Business School and the Harvard Kennedy School of Government.
